1. Eligibility

A Full Member of a Reciprocal Club **who is visiting the United Kingdom for a short period (not exceeding six weeks)** is entitled to make use of the facilities at Lord's, subject to the procedures and regulations described and referred to herein. Such Members are described in this document as "Visiting Overseas Members". Members who hold restricted forms of membership, or maintain a business or residential address in the United Kingdom, are not eligible to enjoy the reciprocal arrangements.

2. Procedure

Visiting Overseas Members should apply to their Club Secretary or Club Manager, at least **one month** before leaving for the United Kingdom, for a Card of Introduction. On arrival at Lord's, the Visiting Overseas Member should visit the M.C.C. Membership Office and produce: a card or letter of introduction; a membership pass or other accreditation; a passport or other form of identity containing a photograph; and evidence of permanent address.

In addition, a passport-sized photograph **must** be provided to the M.C.C. Membership Office, since all M.C.C. membership passes contain photographs of the Members to whom the passes have been issued. The Visiting Overseas Member is then provided with an M.C.C. Reciprocal Overseas Member's pass, which is yellow, and other relevant information including the Regulations and General Information for Members' booklet.

3. Visiting Lord's

The yellow membership pass entitles the Visiting Overseas Member to the benefits and privileges of Associate membership of M.C.C. These include, but are not restricted to, admission to the Ground, Pavilion and Members' Friends' Enclosures. Visiting Overseas Members also enjoy other privileges, as contained in Regulation 3(j), apart from not being permitted to participate in M.C.C. Golf Days. Visiting Overseas Members may also enjoy these privileges, but are not permitted to wear M.C.C. colours.

The cost of a Visiting Overseas Member's pass, in a year when England play Australia in a Test Match at Lord's, is based on a sliding scale which is dependent upon the length of the visit. In other years, no charge is made for such passes.

(a) Major Match Days

On all match lists, major match days are shown in capital letters. For any of the match days that are not listed below, Visiting Overseas Members must purchase public tickets in order to attend the match. For information regarding ticket availability, Visiting Overseas Members should be directed to the Lord's website. All ticket applications must be accompanied by photocopies of the card/letter of introduction and the Visiting Overseas Member's pass or other accreditation.

On other major match days, Associate Members of M.C.C., including Visiting Overseas Members, are admitted free of charge to the Ground, Pavilion and Members' Friends' Enclosures, on production of their Visiting Overseas Members' passes. For 2011 these days are as follows:

England v. Sri Lanka (Test Match) – Third Day – Sunday 5th June
England v. Sri Lanka (Test Match) – Fourth Day – Monday 6th June
England v. Sri Lanka (Test Match) – Fifth Day – Tuesday 7th June
Middlesex v. Essex – Twenty20– Thursday 9th June
Middlesex v. Sussex – Twenty20– Thursday 16th June
England v. Sri Lanka (NatWest Series) – Sunday 3rd July
Middlesex v. Surrey – Twenty20– Thursday 7th July
England v. India (Test Match) – Fourth Day – Sunday 24th July
England v. India (Test Match) – Fifth Day – Monday 25th July
Clydesdale Bank 40 Final – Saturday 17th September

On the above days, Visiting Overseas Members may purchase up to two Rover tickets, subject to availability, for their guests. Payment must be made by Visa, Mastercard or Maestro, or by Sterling traveller's cheque or cash.

Rover tickets admit guests to the Members' Friends' Enclosures. In addition, a Visiting Overseas Member may introduce to the Pavilion one guest on Middlesex's Twenty20 Cup match days. Visiting Overseas Members and their guests should refer to the Dress Regulations which govern entry to the Pavilion and the Members' Friends' Enclosures. These are explained in the Regulations and General Information for Members' booklet.

(b) Other Match Days

On other match days, Associate Members of M.C.C., including Visiting Overseas Members, are admitted to the Ground, Pavilion and Members' Friends' Enclosures. They may introduce to the Pavilion one guest each, who must have paid the relevant Ground Admission charge.

(c) Non-match Days

The best way of viewing Lord's Ground is by joining one of the public tours which, during the summer months, take place daily at 10 a.m., 12 noon and 2 p.m.; during the winter months, between October and March, tours are conducted at 12 noon and 2 p.m. Visiting Overseas Members may join a tour free of charge, on production of the yellow membership pass. All other persons, including members of his or her family, must pay the appropriate charge if they wish to join one of the tours.
