THE LAST TIME THE DEMONS AND HAWKS MET AT THE 'G

In Round 7, 2019 Hawthorn and Melbourne met at the Melbourne Cricket Ground. The match was played on Saturday May 4 commencing at 1.45 in front of a crowd of 40,864 fans. Hawthorn led at quarter time and half time. Melbourne were desperate for a victory but played a less than convincing first half. Five goals to two in the third quarter handed Melbourne the advantage, but Hawthorn was still not out of the match. Fans sat on the edge of their seats as the Hawks went forward in the final minute, but their effort was denied and Melbourne held on to win by five points 11.13 (79) to 11.8 (74). The Demons' midfielder James Harmes dominated the second half and ruckman Max Gawn controlled the hit-outs. For Hawthorn, Liam Shiels led the way with 29 disposals. Melbourne's leading goalkicker was Jayden Hunt with two goals and nine Demons recorded one goal, while Hawthorn's leading goalkickers were Luke Breust (4 goals) and Jack Gunston (3 goals). The Brownlow Medal voting: James Harmes (Melbourne) 3 votes, Jack Gunston (Hawthorn) 2 votes and Max Gawn (Melbourne) 1 vote. Melbourne was coached by Simon Goodwin and captained by Nathan Jones. Hawthorn was coached by Alastair Clarkson and captained by Ben Stratton.

STAN SPINKS – A HAWTHORN CHAMPION.

Stanley James Spinks (left) was born in Hawthorn on October 16, 1912. He joined Hawthorn from local team Auburn in 1931. He was a right-foot kick and 171cm (5'7") tall, weighing 79kg (174lbs). At Hawthorn he played from 1931 to 1941 in a total of 143 matches in which he kicked 19 goals. He played as either a centreman or wingman during his career. Spinks finished second in the 1938 Brownlow Medal count, missing out by one vote to Dick Reynolds. He won the Hawthorn best and fairest award in 1932 and 1938. Spinks represented Victoria three times, in 1934, 1937 and 1939. He finished his playing career with Camberwell in the Victorian Football Association. He was an active committeeman at Hawthorn and served as a club selector. In 2007, Stan Spinks was inducted into the Hawthorn Hall of Fame. He passed away on October 23, 2003 at Broadbeach, Queensland aged 91 years.

This Round in History – Round 5 on the MCG

The two highest scores in Round 5 matches on the MCG are Hawthorn's 31.19 (205) against North Melbourne in 1988 and Richmond's 29.25 (199) against Fitzroy in 1980. Richmond's winning margin of 118 points in the latter game is also the greatest on the MCG in Round 5. The best score in any quarter in Round 5 matches on the MCG was in the above Hawthorn-North Melbourne match when the Hawks kicked 11.7 in the third quarter to extinguish any half-time hopes of a North Melbourne victory. The largest attendance for a Round 5 match was set when 90,508 people gathered at the MCG for the 2007 Collingwood-Essendon ANZAC Day game. This bettered the previous record of 87,549 for the 1996 match between the clubs at the MCG on ANZAC Day.

SOME HIGHLIGHTS BETWEEN THE TEAMS

- In Round 17, 1964 at Glenferrie Oval, Melbourne 10.13 (73) defeated Hawthorn 10.9 (69). Hassa Mann (Melbourne) scored a miracle goal to help his team replace Hawthorn in the final four.
- In Round 1, 1981, at the MCG Hawthorn 23.15 (153) defeated Melbourne 16.16 (112) with 32,202 fans in attendance. Leigh Matthews (Hawthorn) scored 11 goals (a record for a rover/forward pocket).
- In Round 8, 2006, before a crowd of 42,985, David Neitz kicked his 547th goal for the Demons breaking Norm Smith's club record.
- In Round 1, 2010 a crowd of 45,615 at the MCG saw Hawthorn 17.15 (117) defeat Melbourne 8.13 (61). The match included 18 natural left-footers – Hawthorn 13 and Melbourne five.

Q1 Glenferrie Oval. **Q2** Sir Albert Chadwick (Melbourne and Hawthorn) and Sir Gilbert Chandler (Hawthorn). Bert Chadwick played 141 games and kicked 45 goals with Melbourne from 1920 to 1928. He was captain coach in 1924 to 1927 including the 1926 flag. At Hawthorn he was captain coach in 1929 with 17 games and 8 goals. Gilbert Chandler played one game with Hawthorn in 1928. **Q3** 1939. **Q4** Dermott Brereton (1982). **Q5** Brian Dixon (1956-57, 1959-60 and 1964). **Q6**. Alan Joyce, who coached the Hawks to the 1988 and 1991 flags. **Q11** Numbers 44 and 13. **Q12** John Northey.
