Debit or credit card (no cash)




Bag (A4 size or smaller)

I have organised transport to and from the MCG for the upcoming concert. The MCG has very limited car parking so taking public transport or arranging to be dropped off on Clarendon St may be my best option.



I have downloaded my ticket from the Ticketek app to my phone's wallet. My ticket will be available in my digital wallet from November 5.



When I arrive at the MCG, I will check my ticket for the correct gate to enter and then join the queue. It will be a popular event so there will be lots of noisy and excited people outside the stadium.



If I have mobility needs, I can use the free 'G Train shuttle service to help me get from Richmond Station, Jolimont Station or the accessibility parking area in Yarra Park to the MCG.





Before I enter, I will need to complete the MCG's security process. I may be asked to pass through a metal detector or open my bag.


This is for safety reasons.



Security may also scan me with their wand. I will need to lift up my arms and turn around.



I will scan my ticket at the turnstile using my phone. When the light on the screen turns green, I will push the metal turnstile arms or wait for the gate to open and enter the stadium.



If I have a GA Front Standing or GA Rear Standing ticket, I will receive a wristband from staff when I enter the stadium and will need to wear this on my wrist at all times.



I will find my seat using the information on my ticket and watch the concert from my allocated seat.

Section M is Level 1, Section N is Level 2, Section P is Level 2A (Shane Warne Stand) or Level 3 (all other stands), Section Q is Level 4.

GA Front Standing and GA Rear Standing are on the Arena Floor.





The crowd will make a lot of noise when they first see AC/DC.



I will see people singing, dancing and talking.
I can join in if I want to.





I will see pyrotechnics. This mean flames, smoke and special effects. There will also be confetti.



If I need a break from the stimulation of the concert, I can visit the MCG's Sensory Friendly Space.

It is located in the Australian Sports Museum inside Gate 3 on Level 1.



I can buy food and drink as well as merchandise both inside and outside the MCG using my bank card. The MCG is a cashless venue.



If I need help at any stage, I can ask the MCG
Staff. They wear orange, blue and green uniforms.
Security, First Aid and Victoria Police are also
available if I need them.
