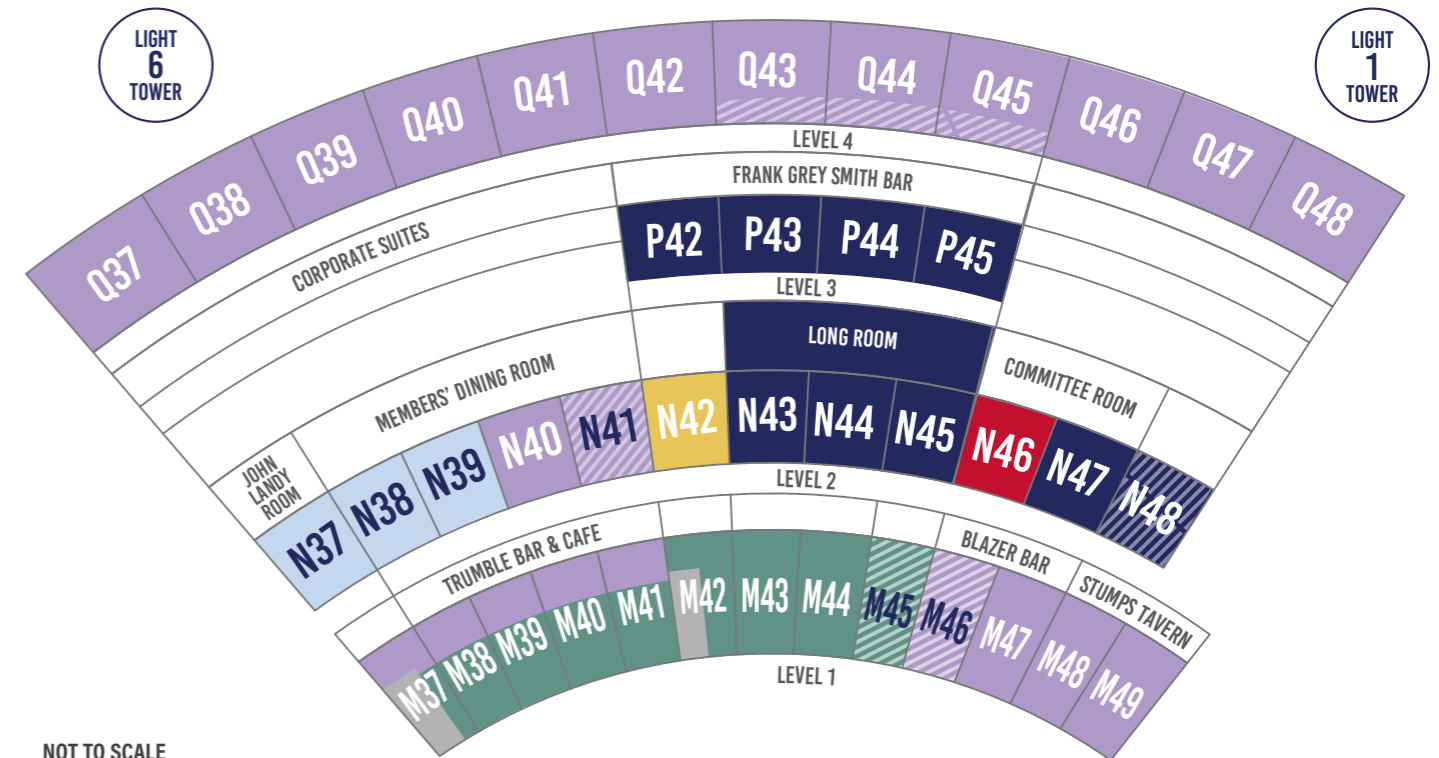

VISITING THE MEMBERS' RESERVE

FOR THE 2024 AFL PREMIERSHIP SEASON

AFL matches played at the MCG have been assigned a category according to their expected demand from members and their guests to attend the Members' Reserve. These categories determine match access for members, what areas can be entered and how many visitor tickets and Long Room or Balcony passes a member can obtain for their guests.

MCC MEMBERS' RESERVE OPERATIONS

For all home and away matches in the 2024 AFL Premiership Season, unreserved and reserved seating areas will be available throughout the Members' Reserve.

Members will be able to reserve a seat on Levels 1, 2 and 4 of the Members' Reserve via Ticketek. Any unallocated reserved seating will be made available as unreserved seating on the match day on a first-in, first-served basis, subject to capacity and availability.

TICKET RETURNS AVAILABLE IN THE MEMBERS' RESERVE

Purchased a ticket but can no longer attend? You can now return your pre-purchased ticket for AFL matches at the MCG via the Ticketek app.

BEHAVIOUR

Members and their guests in the Members' Reserve are expected to observe a standard of behaviour that is socially acceptable and in keeping with the standards befitting the Club, guided by our Code of Conduct.

Whilst barracking for your team is encouraged, members and their guests are expected to respect others within the vicinity.

Aggressive behaviour, bad language, offensive remarks and failing to adhere to instructions from staff, misuse of ticketing privileges, as well as smoking or vaping

inside the MCG, will not be tolerated under any circumstances.

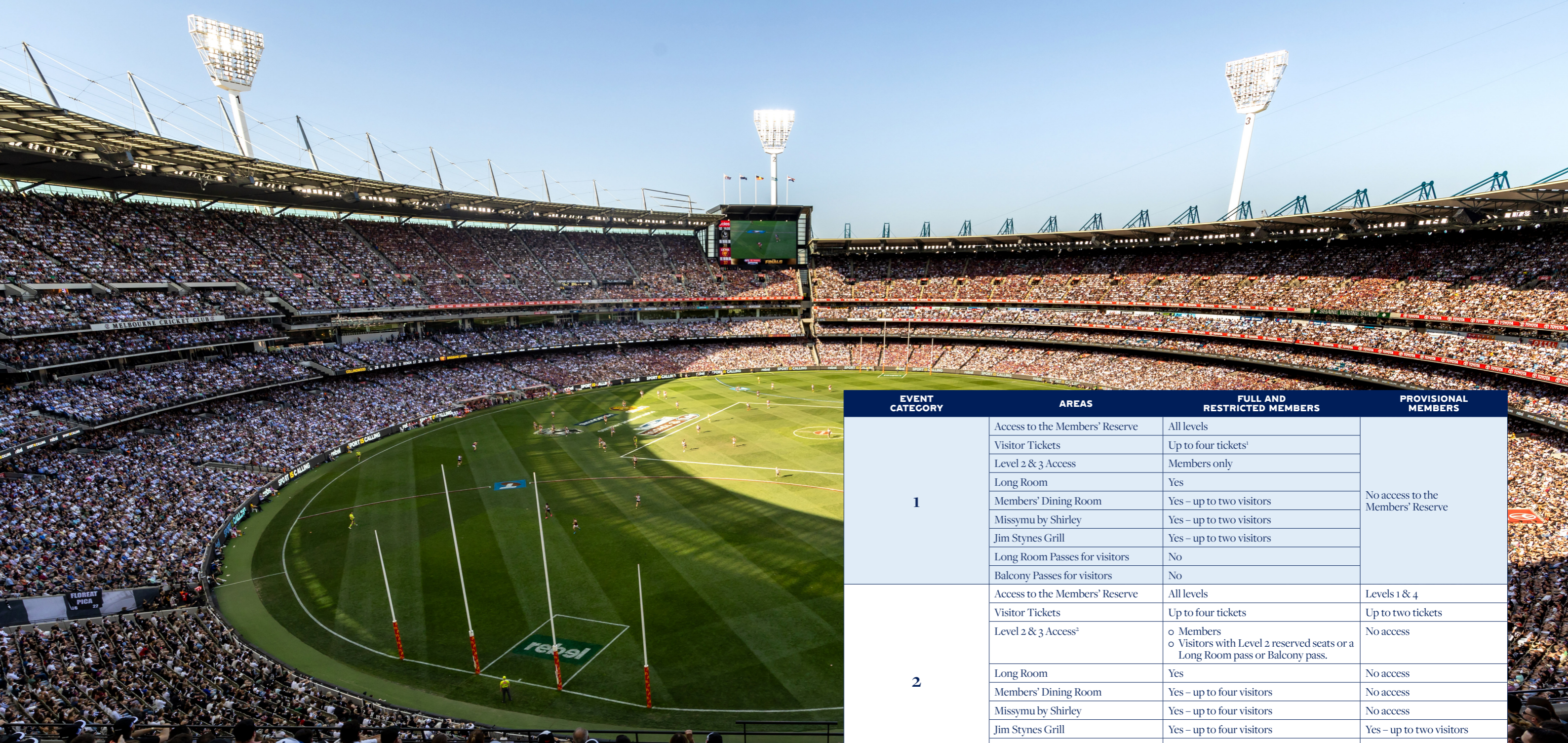
Members are reminded that they are responsible for the behaviour of their guests, and inappropriate behaviour by members or guests may result in suspension or cancellation of memberships.

Members should take particular note that the Club has mandated an update to the Club's Disciplinary Penalty Guide in relation to racist behaviour or any comments of a vilifying nature. The Club has adopted a zero tolerance approach

towards racist behaviour and comments, and members (or their guests) found guilty of this conduct will now face expulsion from the Club.

Members who witness inappropriate behaviour are urged to report the matter to the nearest staff member or by texting 'assist' to the MCG's anti-social behaviour reporting text message service (0409 117 621).

MATCH CATEGORIES

Matches at the MCG will be classified as a Category 1, 2 or 3 match for Full, Restricted and Provisional members in accordance with attendance estimates and expected demand of amenities.

Full and Restricted members, as well as Annual Guest Card holders, have access to the Members' Reserve for all home and away matches of the 2024 AFL Premiership Season. For a small number of matches when the attendance of Full and Restricted members and their guests is forecast to be high, Provisional members may have limited or no access to the Members' Reserve.

The following table provides an overview of what is available to members in each category, including Provisional member access, visitor tickets, dining access and Long Room or Balcony pass conditions.

Note: Annual Guest Card holders have the same access rights as a visitor.

#Dining registrations and passes applications open at 9.00am (Melbourne time) on the Monday (except where the Monday is a public holiday) two weeks prior to each round and close at 5.00pm (Melbourne time) on the following day. Pass applications close at 5.00pm (Melbourne Time) on the Tuesday of the following week or until all passes are exhausted. Match details, categories and on-sale dates for games in rounds 16-24 will be communicated to members once confirmed.

RESERVED SEATING

Members may purchase reserved seating for themselves and visitors in accordance with match category conditions.

Reserved seats incur a \$12 charge (plus Ticketek fees). Reserved seats must be in the same transaction as visitor tickets in order to be seated in the same location.

Any unallocated reserved seating will be made available as unreserved seating on the match day on a first-in, first-served basis, subject to capacity and availability.

VISITOR TICKETS

Full and Restricted members are able to purchase up to four visitor tickets to all home and away matches (with the exception of ANZAC Day where limit is up to two) at the MCG during the 2024 AFL Premiership Season, subject to availability.

Provisional members are able to purchase visitor tickets for category 2 and 3 matches. See the membership categories table on page 5 and the fixture on page 6 for details.

ALCOHOL-FREE BAYS

Alcohol-free bays have been allocated within the Members' Reserve. Alcohol-free seating areas will be allocated in both unreserved and reserved seating areas.

- M45 (unreserved) & M46 (reserved) - inclusive of standing bays
- N48 (unreserved) & N41 (reserved)
- Q43-Q45 rows A-F (reserved)

Note: Any unallocated reserved seating in alcohol free bays will be made available for alcohol free unreserved seating.

ACCESSIBLE SEATING AND COMPANION CARDS

Reserved seating for mobility-impaired patrons, including wheelchair spaces and carers (with a companion card) are available to redeem via Ticketek at ticketek.com.au/accessibility, by calling 1300 665 915 or in-person at the Club.

Accessible seating is available on Levels 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the Members' Reserve. Availability is event dependent. We encourage members to pre-book these spaces. However, unreserved spaces will also be available on match days on a first-come, first-served basis.

Companions attending on a government issued companion card (of either a member or a visitor) receive free entry to the Members' Reserve - for more details visit companioncard.vic.gov.au.

TICKETING CONDITIONS

- A limit of 10 tickets per transaction applies, subject to match category entitlements.
- Tickets can be purchased via the Ticketek website (ticketek.com.au/mccmembers), by calling the MCC members priority line on 1300 136 961, at Ticketek agencies or the Membership Services Office at the Club, Monday to Friday, 9.00am to 5.00pm. Tickets may also be purchased at the Gate 2 ticket windows on match days, subject to availability.
- When purchasing tickets at a Ticketek agency, Membership Services or Gate 2, your membership card will be required.
- Only members can collect pre-purchased tickets from the right of Gate 2 on match day. Visitors cannot collect pre-purchased tickets.
- Provided they are accompanied by an MCC member, children with a junior AFL club membership may enter the Members' Reserve and access unreserved seating at no cost, or purchase a reserved seat for \$6 via Ticketek, for matches at which their card would have granted them access to the public areas of the ground.
- Members are required to be in attendance with visitors.
- Misuse of MCC membership ticketing privileges may result in disciplinary action in-line with the MCC's Code of Conduct and Penalty Guide.





FOOD AND BEVERAGE

The Members' Reserve boasts an extensive selection of bars, cafes and dining experiences.

Whether arriving early, taking a break from the action or soaking up the post-match atmosphere, there are plenty of food and drink options available to members and their guests.

Please note, food and beverage facilities in the Members' Reserve will be available based on estimated attendance per match day. Menus are subject to change throughout the season.

MEMBERS' DINING ROOM, JIM STYNES GRILL, MISSYMU BY SHIRLEY AND COMMITTEE ROOM BY GROSSI

Applications for tables in the Members' Dining Room, Jim Stynes Grill, Missymu by Shirley and Committee Room by Grossi† open at 9.00am (Melbourne time) on the Monday* two weeks prior to each round and close at 5.00pm (Melbourne time) on the following day.

Registrations can be made through the MCC website or MCC App on each event page or by calling the Club on (03) 9657 8888.

At the time of registering members will be required to provide:

- Name
- Member number
- Number of people dining (incl. member numbers of other members in the group)
- Preferred dining time

When registrations exceed room capacity, a ballot will be conducted and all registered members will be notified of the outcome. Members who are unsuccessful may be offered priority access to other match day dining facilities. This will be communicated following the ballot if applicable.

Members and visitors who secure dining in the Members' Dining Room, Missymu by Shirley and Committee Room by Grossi (when available to members) will also access a Level 2 reserved seat as part of their booking. Members and visitors who secure dining in the Jim Stynes Grill will also have access to Level 2 seating behind the glass in the room. To gain entry, members will scan in with their membership card and visitors are able to obtain a general admission visitor tickets.

Missymu by Shirley will also be available for post-match dining for selected matches. These matches will be listed at mcc.org.au/dining.

ADDITIONAL DINING

On select match days, the Club may have access to other dining facilities within or close to the Members' Reserve.

Members who are unsuccessful in the ballot will be offered priority access to attractive match day dining packages in these facilities. This will be communicated following the ballot if applicable.

BALCONY SEATING

ON LEVELS 2 AND 3 & BALCONY PASSES

Unreserved seating on Levels 2 and 3 will be available for eligible members as well as visitors with Long Room or Balcony passes on a first-in, first-served basis in accordance with the match category conditions.

Once an unreserved seat has been chosen on Levels 2 and 3, those in attendance will be issued with a reserved seat ticket.

Balcony passes can be obtained (subject to match category conditions) in order for visitors to access unreserved Balcony seating on Levels 2 and 3.

LONG ROOM

The Long Room is only accessible for eligible members as well as visitors with a Long Room pass aged 18 and older.

A Long Room pass can be obtained for visitors aged 18 years and over (subject to match category conditions), which provides access to the Long Room and unreserved Balcony seating on Levels 2 and 3 of the Members' Reserve. Dress regulations apply. Find out more at mcc.org.au/longroom.

BALCONY PASS AND LONG ROOM PASS CONDITIONS

Members can apply for Balcony or Long Room passes depending on the match category, subject to availability. Application for Long Room and Balcony passes open at 9:00am (Melbourne time) on the Monday* two weeks prior to each round, and close at 5:00pm (Melbourne time) on the Tuesday of the following week or until all passes are exhausted.

Applications will be processed in order of receipt and accepted online via the website.

There is a limit of 10 successful advanced applications per member for the season. Members who do not collect their allocated passes on more than one occasion without prior notice to the Club will be excluded from making applications for the season.

All available passes not allocated in advance will be available for collection on match day from the passes window on the left hand side of Gate 2.

*Unless Monday is a public holiday, in which case applications will open on the Tuesday.





GENERAL INFORMATION

50-YEAR MEMBERS

The Club provides a reserved seating area (N42) and the John Landy Room, both on Level 2, for the exclusive use of MCC 50-Year members. The introduction of guests into the room and seating area is subject to demand.

Pre-booked reserved seating and unreserved seating in the 50-Year members' area will be available for 50-Year members and their guests. A dedicated amount of seats will be allocated for pre-booking via Ticketek while there will also be unreserved seats set aside for 50-Year members and their guests to access on match day. These seats can be obtained by the 50-Year member from the host in the John Landy Room.

A reminder that an additional standard of dress is required in the John Landy Room. Additional details can be found on page 15 of this Guide.

MISUSE OF MEMBERSHIP CARDS

Membership cards are for personal use only and are strictly non-transferrable under any circumstances.

It is the member's responsibility to ensure their card is secure at all times to prevent it being used by other people.

Misuse of membership cards may result in suspension or expulsion of a member.

Random checks of photo ID membership cards and digital membership cards will be undertaken at the turnstiles and throughout the Members' Reserve during the season.

LOST, STOLEN OR FORGOTTEN MEMBERSHIP CARDS

Members who lose, damage or have their card stolen must notify the Club as soon as possible. Unless a police report is provided, a \$25 fee is payable to have the card replaced.

A member who forgets their membership card on an event day can scan into the Members' Reserve using their digital card via the MCC App, or may obtain an entry ticket, subject to appropriate identification by a Membership Services staff member at Gate 2. There is a fee of \$10 charged to obtain an entry ticket.

THE MCG IS A CASHLESS VENUE

A reminder that the MCG, including the MCC Members' Reserve, is cashless venue. All food, beverage, merchandise and ticketing outlets - including MCC Membership Services - are cashless - so transactions will need to be made on your debit or credit card, or MCC Plus card where applicable.

DRESS STANDARDS

The Melbourne Cricket Club prides itself as a warm, welcoming and inclusive club steeped in tradition. In an effort to retain the high standards of the MCC, the Club maintains a dress code for members and their guests.

MEMBERS' RESERVE



Dress standards will be strictly enforced during the 2024 AFL Premiership Season, with Club management and staff authorised by the Committee to enforce the code. To avoid issues at entry, members should ensure that their attire, and that of their guests, is neat and appropriate to the various areas being visited within the Members' Reserve.

Additional standards of dress are required in specific areas within the Members' Reserve.

DRESS STANDARDS

MEMBERS' DINING ROOM, JOHN LANDY ROOM AND LONG ROOM



⊗ THE FOLLOWING ATTIRE IS NOT PERMITTED

WITHIN THE MEMBERS' DINING ROOM, JOHN LANDY ROOM AND LONG ROOM:

- Any form of sports shoe or sneakers
- Pullovers or cardigans (without a jacket), rugby tops and football guernseys (even if worn with a tie)
- Jeans, cargo pants, non-tailored trousers, leggings or shorts (footless tights are acceptable if a dress or skirt of appropriate length is worn over the top)
- Parkas, duffle coats, wind-breakers, tracksuit tops, golf and yachting weatherproofs, waist-length jackets (including bomber jackets), denim jackets, zippered jackets, anoraks and driz-a-bones
- Hats, caps, and any other headwear (unless part of national or religious dress)

Please note: The dress standards in the Members' Dining Room, John Landy Room and Long Room for members and their guests who identify as male is a lounge suit or tailored jacket, shirt, tie, trousers (tailored chinos are acceptable) and dress shoes.

⊗ THE FOLLOWING ATTIRE IS NOT PERMITTED

WITHIN THE MEMBERS' RESERVE:

- Singlet tops
- Any form of sports (running, athletic, gym or bike) shorts and sportswear (gym clothes, tracksuits, leggings, tights, and tennis skirts)
- Thongs, scuffs, dilapidated footwear, gumboots, slippers or UGG boots
- Torn, ripped or ragged clothing of any kind (including designer)
